NORTHEAST FLORIDA

PUTNAM COUNTY

The heavily vegetated and stumpfilled Rodman Reservoir is a largemouth bass fishing hot spot. Located southwest of Palatka, Rodman is always near the top of the list for Florida's best bass fishing destinations. January yields the largest fish. Bass swim to deeper water during that time of year. In the spring, they spawn in shallow areas. By summer, they may wander into the Ocklawaha River channel and the Cross Florida Barge Canal. There, water can reach depths of 30 feet. Anglers use golden shiners floated under a cork, free-lined in pockets or along walls of hydrilla mats. Other weedless lures such as soft plastic worms, jerkbaits and spinnerbaits also attract bass.

Black crappie also are caught along the Cross Florida Barge Canal and Ocklawaha River channel on minnows, tiny jigs and spinners. They frequent the area primarily in the winter. Catfish, bluegill, redear sunfish, spotted sunfish, redbreast



sunfish and stumpknocker are other popular species found in *Rodman Reservoir*.

Lake George, on the St. Johns River, also has attracted attention as one of Florida's premier bass fishing lakes. Anglers prefer to use live shiners and artificial bait near the eelgrass beds and deeper pilings of this 46,000acre lake to attract bass. Recent hurricanes eliminated some of the grass beds, but they are making a return.

DUVAL & NASSAU COUNTIES

The St. Johns River flows north for more than 300 miles through Northeast Florida and is well known as a largemouth bass fishing location. Fishing the banks near and among submerged vegetation with weedless, soft plastic baits, jerkbaits and top water lures produce the best results when bass fishing. Moving water also attracts these fish, which can be fooled with shad-imitating lures.

The Nassau River winds eastward north of Jacksonville, where it meets the Atlantic Ocean. It is best known for a striped bass population that is fished December through May. Some prize catches in the river top 20 pounds. While fishing for stripers, many anglers land saltwater trout, drum and redfish found in the same areas. Favorite striper baits include live eels fished near bridge pilings and deepdiving lures resembling shad, which are fished during falling tides.

CLAY COUNTY

INDEPENDENT LIFE

Part of the St. Johns River, Doctor's Inlet is a good location for largemouth bass and redear sunfish. Bass schools swim through the lush beds of eelgrass year-round. The best fishing will occur upstream of Palatka and in the holes at this waterway's bottom.

FLAGLER COUNTY

Lake Crescent is considered a prime spot for anglers targeting bass and black crappie. Bass catches occur near docks and structures that reach depths of more than three feet during the fall months. Live shiners, weedless spoons, plastic worms and jerkbaits are recommended in these areas. Biologists note this lake has had some of the highest fish counts in the St. Johns River area.

Anglers fishing for crappie can do well drifting in open water with minnows or jigs in winter and early spring. The south end of *Lake Crescent*, near the mouths of *Dead Lake* and *Haw Creek*, also is a popular area.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

The coastal waters of St. Augustine provide a great fishing expedition for any angler. One place to drop a line is Crescent Beach, located 25 minutes from downtown St. Augustine, on Anastasia Island. Another site is Vilano Beach, a short three-minute drive from the city. Anglers can fish off the pier or charter a deep-sea fishing boat in Vilano Beach. Home of the annual Kingfish Challenge and billfish tournaments, St. Augustine's waters also offer marlin, dolphin, flounder, seatrout and redfish.

ATLANTIC WATERS


The Atlantic waters off *Fernandina Beach* provide a range of fishing opportunities for species, including grouper, king mackerel, cobia, black sea bass, sheepshead, black drum, Florida pompano, bluefish, flounder, and sand (white) and speckled trout. Anglers can watch for the greater amberjack, a fish that has been known to reach more than 150 pounds and five feet in length.

FLAGLER BEACH

Flagler Beach is a narrow island located between Highway A1A along the Atlantic Ocean and the *Intracoastal Waterway*, a deep-water channel through wetlands and marshes. In *Flagler Beach* waters, fishing enthusiasts are sure to find blue crabs and tarpon. At the *Flagler Beach Pier*, anglers can cast off into the Atlantic or launch a boat from the county dock or the state park. Anglers will find bluefish, whiting, flounder, redfish, king mackerel, snapper, sheepshead and tarpon.

JACKSONVILLE

A myriad of fish surround the *Jacksonville* area, including grouper, sailfish, yellowfin tuna, wahoo, black sea bass, red snapper, amberjack, cobia, jack crevalle, king mackerel and Spanish mackerel.
