

JACKSON COUNTY

Lake Seminole is a 37,500-acre artificial lake located within both Florida and Georgia. This water body was formed by construction of the Jim Woodruff Dam near Chattahoochee. Featuring a wide variety of sport fish species, the lake's reputated as one of the best fishing sites in the country with largemouth bass fishing year-round. Black crappie, catfish and bream can also be found in the lake. Plastic worms, spinnerbaits and top water lures are bass angler favorites. Bream will hit crickets, earthworms and artificial flies. Three Rivers State Park near Chattahoochee is a good place to access the lake.

Ocheesee Pond is a good spot for large bluegill. Try using grass shrimp or crickets as bait around submerged stumps or snags. Largemouth bass fishing is good using conventional lures and live shiners.

HOLMES COUNTY

Drop a line in *Lake Victor* for largemouth bass, black crappie, channel catfish, bluegill and redear sunfish. Night fishing the lake offers an even better opportunity to catch bass, bream and catfish during the summer months.

BAY COUNTY

Located near Panama City Beach, 5,000-acre *Deer Point Lake* offers good largemouth bass fishing from fall through springtime. Anglers should fish in the early morning, late evening or at night during the hot summer months.

CALHOUN, FRANKLIN, GULF, JACKSON, & LIBERTY COUNTIES

The Apalachicola River runs south from Lake Seminole, winding more than 100 miles to the Gulf of Mexico. The upper portion of the river has a variety of fish including striped bass and sunshine bass, which are caught on jigs, spoons and live shad. Flathead catfish in the river bite large shiners and bream fished on the bottom.

Dead Lake, located in Calhoun and Gulf counties near Wewahitchka, is known for its bream fishing. The best fishing occurs in the early morning or late evening, using crickets and earthworms.

ESCAMBIA & SANTA ROSA COUNTIES

The Escambia River is home to 85 recorded freshwater fish—more than any other river in Florida. These include bluegill, redear sunfish, largemouth bass, black crappie and more. Good fishing occurs throughout the river, including the lower delta and associated marshes, known for producing catches of largemouth bass on crankbaits and live shrimp.

Record-sized blue catfish and flathead catfish also can be found in the river. They are taken on heavy tackle and live sunfish. Sunshine bass also populate the river in large numbers, especially in the lower region. Live shrimp, spoons and jigs are favorite baits.

WALTON, WASHINGTON, HOLMES & BAY COUNTIES

The Choctawhatchee River passes through these counties stretching from the Alabama border into Florida. The river yields its best fishing when the water level is low. Largemouth bass, spotted bass, crappie, bream and catfish can be caught in this river, along with sunshine bass that are stocked annually.

OKALOOSA COUNTY

Hurricane Lake contains a variety of fish, including largemouth bass, bluegill, redear sunfish (shellcracker) and channel catfish. Located in the Blackwater State Forest, this man-made lake can be more productive for anglers who use live bait and fish on cloudy days.

Karick Lake, another man-made lake, also has good fishing for largemouth bass, bluegill, redear sunfish and channel catfish. The timber throughout the lake provides a good fishing habitat.

LIBERTY COUNTY

Located west of Tallahassee, the Ochlockonee River runs through Lake Talquin, exiting from the Jim Woodruff Dam. Several species of catfish are available. Redbreast sunfish and crappie can be fished among the snags and brush piles.

PENSACOLA

The waters around Pensacola offer recreational fishermen a wealth of opportunities. Blue marlin, sailfish, wahoo and tuna are plentiful in the offshore waters around Pensacola. Red snapper, grouper and other reef fish are found around the numerous artificial reefs in this region. Other great fishing sites such as Perdido Key, Navarre Beach and Gulf Breeze are located within an easy drive of Pensacola.

FORT WALTON/DESTIN

Fort Walton Beach and Destin have seasonal runs of up to 20 species of saltwater fish, including cobia. The Choctawhatchee Bay has sheepshead, white and spotted seatrout, Spanish mackerel, and red drum.

Access to deeper water is within 10 miles of Destin's east pass, giving anglers an opportunity to catch open water and deep-sea bottom fish. Blue and white marlin, dolphin, wahoo, red snapper, grouper, amberjack, and triggerfish are some of the species targeted in this deeper water.

PANAMA CITY

Panama City Beach yields plenty of whiting, pompano, Spanish mackerel, black drum, crevalle jack and bluefish. Fishing bay waters will provide redfish, spotted seatrout, sheepshead, flounder and juvenile grouper. Offshore anglers will have their chance at red snapper, gag and red grouper, king mackerel, cobia, black sea bass and sailfish.

ST. JOSEPH BAY

Pompano, whiting, bluefish and Spanish mackerel are all commonly caught from the beach using spoons, jigs and live bait. Calmer bay waters full of seagrass harbor spotted seatrout, redfish, sheepshead and Spanish mackerel. This area is also a great place to grab a mask and snorkel to look for some scallops.





APALACHICOLA BAY

In the Apalachicola Bay area, anglers who fish near docks, bridges and sea grass flats can find sheepshead, redfish, seatrout and flounder. These fish will eat a variety of live baits, including shrimp and minnows. Redfish and seatrout are prevalent until mid-October during incoming or outgoing tides. Seatrout prefer cooler water, so anglers should try for these fish using top water plugs in the early

morning or late evening. Grouper, cobia and king mackerel inhabit the deeper waters off Apalachicola Bay. Cobia will often swim inshore around buoys and artificial reefs where anglers can catch them on crabs and live eels.

ST. GEORGE ISLAND

Part of this island is designated as a state park, providing a prime spot to catch whiting, Spanish mackerel, seatrout and redfish along the shore. The east pass of this island is a great place to catch pompano during their seasonal migration. Anglers at Alligator Point can catch trout, redfish and black drum using spoons or shrimp.

ST. MARKS NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

Many anglers fish in the inshore and offshore waters of this productive refuge. Inshore anglers may find redfish, spotted seatrout, tarpon, sheepshead, crevalle jacks, flounder and bluefish. Launching from the boat ramp at the refuge, offshore anglers can pursue gag grouper, red grouper, cobia and black sea bass.
